feel of the city.

Cut flowers, bouquets, potted plants, shrubs, bulbs, bonsai, exotic and traditional plants will be on sale. The Flower Market is just the latest in the specialist market event schedule from Manchester's Markets. The Farmer's Market is now a regular fixture, selling local produce and specialised meats, cheeses and delicacies every month in the nearby Northern Quarter.

It is the farmers themselves who attend this market, giving you the opportunity to

ask them all about the products they are selling.

The market contains a number of stalls and brings together farmers from across the North West, selling a whole host of fresh produce.

A wide variety of fresh meats including pork, venison, lamb, beef, ham, sausages, turkey and chicken and fish (smoked salmon, trout and kippers) are available.

The market is held twice monthly, on the second and fourth weekend (Friday and Saturday) of each month. It is open between 10am and 6pm.
