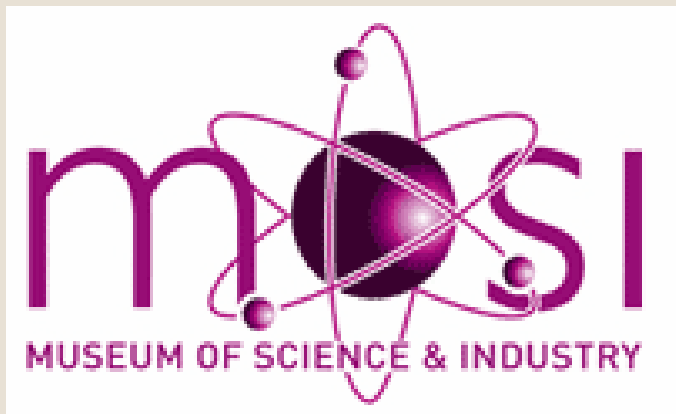

The Flower Market is just the latest in the specialist market event schedule from Manchester's Markets. The Farmer's Market is now a regular fixture, selling local produce and specialised meats, cheeses and delicacies every month in the nearby Northern Quarter. The Farmer's market is held twice monthly, on the second and fourth weekend (Friday and Saturday) of each month, between 10am and 6pm. The market contains a number of stalls and brings together farmers from across the North West, selling a whole host of fresh produce.
